A MISSION FROM GOD

As children we sometimes played games where we imagined we were superheroes, firemen, policemen or some other figure of authority. In these games, we saved the world from evil, put out raging fires, rescued hostages from the bad guys, and a host of other virtuous things. In all of these games we discussed the mission or task that needed to be completed, then we went about to accomplish that mission.

The word mission has many definitions. Among these are the general concepts of a task to be undertaken, a representative group sent to establish relations with another group, a religious outreach, etc. Today in the church, many times when we hear the word "mission" we immediately think of missionaries in foreign countries or in the mission fields of our own country. But the mission of the Christian includes many other aspects in addition to church work in "mission fields."

Paul tells us that the body of Christ is comprised of many members, each having their own ways of contributing to the health and strength of the church (2 Corinthians 12). Each of us participates in the growth of the church in various ways. Not everyone can go to a foreign mission field, but everyone can aid in the process of doing the Lord's work.

Jesus gave a mission to us in Matthew 28:18-20. "And Jesus came and spoke to them, saying, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age. Amen."

Is that your mission today as a Christian? If not, it should be. Someone may answer and say, "But I'm not able to go into a mission field," or "I'm not able to preach or teach to someone else." But God expects us to be his representatives here and to continue in the task of teaching others about the gospel.

Our Lord came to this world for the purpose of seeking and saving the lost (Luke 19:10). Our purpose as Christians should include the spreading of the gospel to a lost and dying world. As Paul stated in 2 Corinthians 5:20, "Now, then we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were pleading through us: we implore you on Christ's behalf, be reconciled to God."

What are you doing to aid in the process of reconciling the world to God through Christ? Are you praying for the efforts of those who teach and preach? Are you supporting these efforts financially? Are you growing in your own knowledge of the word so you can be better equipped to personally teach others? Are you living a sanctified life that will stand as a positive example to others?

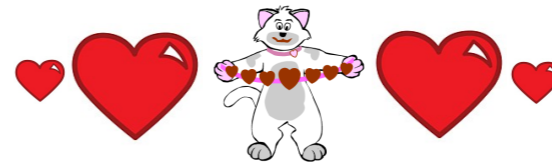
