

FROM THE PREACHER

An Extract from *Larimore and His Boys*

Although most people do not know his name today, T. B. Larimore was a highly influential preacher in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. He was known for his gentle spirit and clear preaching, and was highly sought after for preaching gospel meetings. Larimore was so successful that these gospel meetings would sometimes last for weeks on end. Of particular note is a 22-week gospel meeting in Sherman, TX during which Larimore baptized a child by the name of Batsell Baxter. Baxter would grow up to become a very influential Bible teacher and was the father of the equally influential Batsell Barrett Baxter. Larimore was also known and loved as a teacher at Mars Hill College, which he founded and ran from 1871–1887 in Florence, AL. Today, there is a K-12 private school, Mars Hill Bible School, that traces itself back to Larimore's school.

One of Larimore's students, F. D. Srygley, wrote a biography of Larimore in 1889 (Larimore was 46 at that time) titled *Larimore and His Boys*. In that book, Srygley, with characteristic wit, gives a rather humorous description of Christianity in northern Alabama in the mid-19th century. I got a good laugh out of some of his descriptions and I thought you might enjoy reading a portion of it as well:

"That was a great country for dogs. It was said that in olden times game of various kinds abounded there. In those early days dogs were appreciated for their value in hunting the game. The game had long since departed, but the dogs remained. And being entirely useless, they were simply carried about whithersoever their masters listed, and not unfrequently found their way to church whether anybody listed or not. To a stranger, so many dogs at church might have seemed out of place; but to those accustomed to their presence they seemed appropriate enough. A stranger might even have suggested that so many dogs in church would disturb public worship; but those good people could hardly have seen how that could be possible. Who that appreciates preaching and really wants to hear a good sermon, they thought, could be disturbed by a living pyramid of fighting dogs in the open space about the pulpit? Such a thing might attract the attention of frivolous girls and fun-loving boys; but what does a real worshiper care for a dog fight so long as there is no disposition among the owners of the dogs to take up the quarrel? A stuck-up preacher might have felt it necessary to suggest that the dogs be put out of the church, but those people would have wanted to know very promptly what the preacher had to do with their dogs. Was he not there to preach the gospel? What right had he to take any part in a dog-fight anyhow?" (page 20 of *Larimore and His Boys*, by F. D. Srygley)

Times sure have changed, and while not every change is for the better, I can't help but think that keeping our pets out of the worship service is probably for the best. But perhaps there is a modern application for us: the next time someone complains about children being noisy in church, gently remind them that it could be worse – at least we don't have a pack of dogs in the building!

Marcus Lane is the 3rd candidate, his visit has not been scheduled at this time.



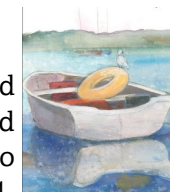
