From the Preacher's Desk

There are some wonderful things we have done, as well as will be doing at the Angleton Church of Christ, that I hope every one of you is aware of. First, this past Saturday we had another game day. While we had quite a lot of people present, I also know many people didn't make it. I understand that we all live busy lives and as much as we wish we could make it to every special event, we can't. That being said, I want to encourage you always to try and be a part of our get-togethers and outings. 1 Thessalonians 5:11 says, "Therefore encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing." Hebrews 10:24-25 says, "And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near." The context of these verses is talking about our spiritual relationship with the brethren. God tells us not to forsake any opportunity in which the body of Christ comes together, especially in worship to Him because we as the body of Christ make each other spiritually stronger. In other news, if you watched your television this past week, you might have noticed the tragic accident that took place at the famed Notre Dame cathedral in Paris. As people watched, in complete shock, the 850-year-old building began crumbling under the heat of a

roaring fire. Construction on the Gothic cathedral began in 1163 and would take over 100 years to complete. It survived the French Revolution, was a home for a colony of bees as part of a more massive effort to protect biodiversity, and supposedly had on display the crown of thorns that was placed on Christ's head. The cathedral was more than 52,000 square feet and was visited by more than twelve million people each year.

As I watched the news footage, while the building collapsed and people prayed in the streets, I couldn't help but be reminded of a particular set of scripture. 2 Peter 3:10, "But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a roar, and the heavenly bodies will be burned up and dissolved, and the earth and the works that are done on it will be exposed." It saddens me to see something as historic as the Notre Dame cathedral be destroyed so quickly; however, as beautiful as it might have been, it wasn't going to last forever. Even if they choose to rebuild, which they probably will, a day will come when God destroys it permanently, along with everything else on this earth. We can never lose sight of the truth, that this world is not our home (1 Peter 2:11); therefore we shouldn't put our trust and love (1 John 2:15-17), in something fleeting. I am saddened that I will never see the original beauty of Notre Dame cathedral, I will never gaze upon its glorious spires, but I'm okay with that because my sights are on something greater! Heaven! A few weeks ago, David talked about the renaming of Jacob to Israel (for a refresher of the narrative see Genesis 32:22-32). In this scene, we see Jacob wrestling with an unknown individual all night. When the day breaks, Jacob is blessed with the name Israel, which roughly means "struggled with God and man, and overcame." Names in the Bible, especially in the Old Testament and Genesis, were very important. Jacob means "grasps at the heel," Isaac means "laughter," and Abraham means, "father of a multitude." These names somewhat foreshadow the character of these men. Jacob's name didn't just refer to how he was holding to Esau's ankle when he was born but was also an euphemism for "trickster" which we see when he tricks Esau out of his birthright. Now think about the name Israel and its meaning for a moment. Jacob wrestled with God (or an angel) all night and prevailed. He held on to this individual and wouldn't let go until he blessed him. Now, I'm not saying we should demand in a selfish manner, but won't He bless us if we hold fast to Him? God wants us to hold to Him and nothing else. What are you willing to let go of to hold on to God?
