

From the Preacher's Desk

First and foremost, I am always grateful to those who are willing to fill in and preach in my absence. I understand the time and sacrifice that comes from crafting a sermon and presenting it, which is why I am grateful. Because I know how difficult it can be, I rarely, if ever, give a specific topic to those who preach for me. I always allow them to pick their lessons, because I want it to be something they are passionate about sharing. If someone asks to continue in one of my series, I still allow them to pick the topic under that theme. The reason I mention this is because of what was said last Sunday evening during worship.

Last Sunday evening, I was given the chance to preach in Freeport at the Southside Church of Christ. I always jump at the opportunity to visit with local congregations because it's important that we fellowship with the saints to strengthen spiritual relationships. My time with that congregation was amazing, and if ever I get the opportunity to go back, I would love for you all to join my family.

As I already said, when people fill in for me, I don't give them a topic, I only ask that they not speak on what I already have planned, and such was the case for Michael this past Sunday evening. Unfortunately, our brother said something from the pulpit that I must address and after we talked, he is planning to address himself publicly. He began his lesson by saying, "David asked me to preach on what we [the church of Christ] get wrong" and that's not the truth. While I did ask him to preach, I never asked him to speak on anything specifically. I didn't even ask that he stick with the Traditions series but allowed him to pick whatever topic he wanted. He told me he wanted to continue in our Sunday evening series and shared with me a broad idea. The reason it's important you understand my involvement in this past Sunday evening worship is that the impression that Michael left was that I asked him to speak on those specific topics and ideas that he shared, and thus, I too believe in what he believes. That is not the truth. While I commend Michael on his passion, I know there was a lot in that lesson that we do not agree on, and it's important

to me that my spiritual family understand that.

The bottom line, the lesson that he brought was his own, and I had no connection with what was said and shared. Sadly, I have decided to suspend, for now, the Sunday evening series, Debunking Religious Trends. When I get up to preach, my whole heart needs to be in my lesson. Times in the past when I have shared something that wasn't ready, or I wasn't passionate about, it made me feel sick. Thinking about continuing our series Debunking Religious Trends makes me feel those uneasy feelings. There is a chance, Lord willing, we will come back to this series in the future; however, at this moment I am going to change gears. Sometimes it's okay to hit the reset button, and in doing so I have reignited my excitement about what I will share with you. I pray that everyone will be a part of these new lessons.

Please understand that I take no joy in writing an article like this and debated on whether it needed to be said at all. In the end, I felt it was important that the congregation know in what capacity I was involved in last Sunday evening's lesson, of which was almost zero. I may not agree with Michael, and I know there are things I believe that he doesn't agree with, but let's not forget that discussion is a part of our daily walk. Every day we face people who don't share our beliefs, or who might share ideas that make us feel uncomfortable. Sitting and having a conversation with those people is what we are commanded to do. It's the spirit behind 1 Peter 3:15, "...but in your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect..." The only way to give a defense is to have a conversation. I'd like to end, how I began. I am grateful that Michael was willing to preach for me, and I hate that I had to address this issue, but my beliefs are important and when people get the wrong impression because of what or how something was said. I must defend those beliefs. If you'd like to talk more with me, my office is always open, my phone is always on, and I am always available. God bless and have a fantastic week!
