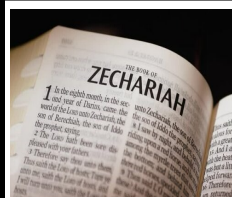

FROM THE PREACHER

What is Repentance of an Unscriptural Remarriage? #2, The Silence of Scripture

Scripture *never* gives instruction for a remarried couple to divorce in order to repent. Nor is there *any example* of a divorce to correct an inappropriate remarriage. Don't let the significance of such silence pass you by. Divorce and remarriage were very common in Jewish and Roman culture in Jesus's day. It is practically certain that there were Christians who had been divorced and remarried in the New Testament Church, and yet *nowhere* is there instruction for them to divorce or an example of such a divorce. The Bible gives instructions for all kinds of proper and improper relationships: Christian marriages, mixed Christian/non-Christian marriages, adulterous relationships (even extreme ones, see 1 Corinthians 5), homosexuality, etc. And yet, not a word on the need for a couple remarried after an improper divorce to get divorced themselves.

This is all the more remarkable when you take into account that Deuteronomy 24:1-4 would have provided the basic understanding of divorce / remarriage regulation for Jewish Christians. Accordingly, they would have assumed that it was forbidden for a remarried couple to get divorced and return to their first spouses. If there was indeed such a fundamental change of protocol, Jesus and His disciples would have needed to provide very explicit instruction indicating the change, which they do not.

Some will object (on the basis of Matthew 19:9) that Jesus defines an improper remarriage as a perpetually adulterous relationship, so we don't need further explicit instruction; a couple must cease living in sin. That passage will be addressed next week, Lord willing, but for now, I will say this: there is nothing in the text demanding a "perpetual adultery" view. Any requirement for a remarried couple to divorce does *not* stand on a biblical command or example, but arises from a person's inference, and an unnecessary one at that.

Foy E. Wallace, Jr. bases much of his conclusion on this subject on the silence of Scripture as well. He is worth quoting at length:

"This law of divorce declares that remarriage by either party after unjustifiable divorce

establishes a state of adultery for the one who does so. But Christ omitted legislating a disciplinary procedure, indicating that such a legalized relation becomes a principle of moral conduct between the parties involved and God, and is left to his own judicial decision, not ours. With no course of action legislated, revealed or prescribed, we cannot make one without human legislation. The course of some preachers in demanding separations and the breaking up of family relations, and the refusal to even baptize certain ones whose marriage status does not measure up to his standard of approval, is a presumptuous procedure. It reveals the tendency to displace God as the Judge of us all, and a preacher ascends to the bench. More than teaching the moral principles involved, the preacher has no course of action revealed, and to establish one would result in human legislation, more far reaching in evil consequences than the moral effects of divorcement limited to the persons involved. There are some things that are not subject to the law of restitution, things done in certain circumstances which cannot in later circumstances be undone, which remain as matters between God and the individual, and therefore reserved for the judgment. It is certain, however, that if the Lord Jesus Christ had intended a course of action in these cases, he would not have left it for preachers to prescribe, but would have himself legislated it." (*The Sermon on the Mount and the Civil State*, 40-41)
