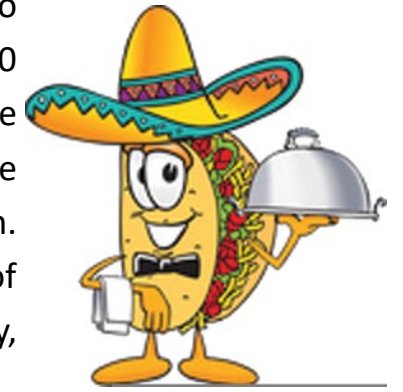

From the Preacher's Desk

"Teamwork Makes the Dream Work"

I recently obtained a copy of a book titled, "Teamwork Makes the Dream Work" by author John C. Maxwell. Although I have not read the book completely, I was flipping through the pages and came across a section titled Profile of a Winning Team. Within the section, the author provides four things winning teams always have in common. I want to share them with you today with the hope that you will think about the many teams you are a part of and how to make them just a little bit better. You may not play sports or you may think you aren't on any teams, but I guarantee for most of us we are on more than we think. Marriage is a team. Your job is a team. Your family is a team. Even this congregation is a team. This book wasn't just for people who played sports; it was a book for everyone. Ecclesiastes 4:9-12 says, "Two are better than one because they have a good reward for their toil. For if they fall, one will lift up his fellow. But woe to him who is alone when he falls and has not another to lift him up! Again, if two lie together, they keep warm, but how can one keep warm alone? And though a man might prevail against one who is alone, two will withstand him – a threefold cord is not quickly broken."

Unity and teamwork are very common themes throughout the Bible. When the twelve were sent out, in Mark 6:7, they were sent out two by two. Why? Couldn't the apostles have covered more ground and talked to more people if they all went their own ways? Perhaps, but as Proverbs 27:17 says, "Iron sharpens iron, and one man sharpens another." When we choose to come together and work as a team we can be successful in all aspects of life including marriages, jobs, and congregations. Stanley C. Gault worked with General Electric for 31 years before being named Chairman of the Board and CEO of Rubbermaid. In regards to teamwork, he once was quoted as saying, "We don't work for each other; we work with each other." It was these attitudes that lead him to be one of the most successful men in business. So how can we strengthen our teams? Author John C. Maxwell gives us four things to consider:

First, WINNING TEAMS PLAY TO WIN. In order for any team to function properly, the group outlook must be the same. Are you in it to win it? If you go into anything haphazardly with no clear perspective of your goal then how much effort will you truly put into the work? Ephesians 4:6, "From whom the whole body, joined and held together by every joint with which it is

equipped, when each part is working properly, makes the body grow so that it builds itself up in love." To strengthen any team, you must first decide what the goal is and then strive to obtain it.

Second, WINNING TEAMS HAVE A WINNING ATTITUDE. 1 Corinthians 1:10, "I appeal to you, brothers, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree, and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same judgment." The author says, "Team members believe in themselves, their teammates, and their dream. And they don't allow negative thinking to derail them." Having the right attitude can make or break a functioning team. That Biblical teaching, "a little leaven, leavens the whole lump," is very accurate. Even a negative attitude will have a greater effect on those around us.

Third, WINNING TEAMS KEEP IMPROVING. A good team, whether it be a marriage or a working relationship, don't stop when the end goal is achieved because there is always room for improvement. That is what is most important to a good team, not what is obtained in the end, but the effect it has had on the relationship of the team. Hebrews 10:24-25 says, "And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near."

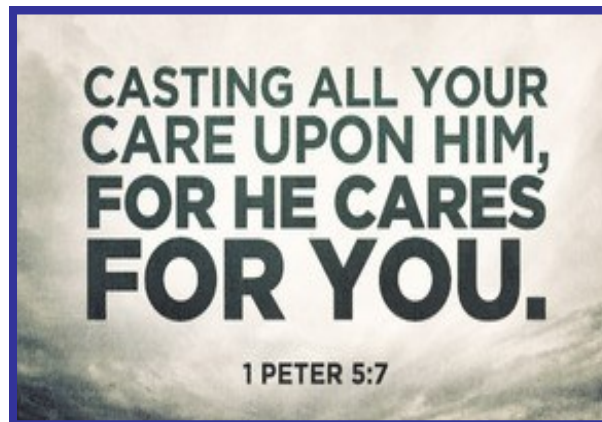
Fourth, WINNING TEAMS MAKE THEIR TEAMMATES MORE SUCCESSFUL. Philippians 2:3-4, "Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. Let each of you look not only to his own interests but also to the interests of others." This is especially important as a congregation. If we want the congregation that meets here to be strong, stable, and successful we must learn to care for each other over ourselves. We must have a humble and selfless attitude in our relationship with one another. Whether it's the congregation that meets every first day of the week or one of our Visitation Teams that meets here at the Angleton Church of Christ, these four approaches to teamwork are sure to help you become closer and stronger. "Even when you've played the game of your life, it's the feeling of teamwork that you'll remember. You'll forget the plays, the shots, and the scores, but you'll never forget your teammates" (Author Unknown). Remember, even when you feel alone, God is always with you. Proverbs 3:5, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding." David Olmos
