A few reminders for this week (and beyond)...

Also, I don't want you to ever feel like you are "bothering me" or "keeping me from my work" because I love nothing more than helping my spiritual family! 2. As Bro. Phil Carter mentioned this past Sunday morning, we have begun our annual canned food drive for the Impact Church of Christ in Houston, Texas. Last year was a huge success for us, and we pushed the congregation to hit some pretty lofty goals. This year we are doing things differently.



First, our focus, just as we have done in the past will be on Vienna Sausages; however, any non-perishable canned goods that you might have can be donated up to October 18th. Phil has already contacted the Kroger here in Angleton, and they are planning on purchasing 50 cases for those who are interested. Second, we know that things have been tough on many families, especially those who have lost work, or whose paychecks took a hit when our economy shut down. For that reason, we are not setting an exorbitant goal. We have no expectations we hope to achieve other than giving those who want, and can, the chance to give to those in need. What that means: if you find yourself out grocery shopping and want to pick up some extra food, thank you. If you are not comfortable going to the store, please

don't worry; you can donate money to the office, and we will make that purchase for you. It's very important that the congregation know there is no pressure to give if you cannot afford, or do not feel comfortable giving. With everything else canceling this year, you might wonder why not our canned food drive as well? Every year we help the Impact congregation and it was important to us that we continue doing this, if for no other reason, to prove that even a pandemic won't stop us from doing our duty as Christians.

3. I wanted to personally thank all of those that



came and offered support for some of the upcoming projects being worked on. I am excited about the future of this congregation, as I hope you are, as well. *Lifeway*, a Christian Resource company, recently stated that they saw a 60% increase in Bible sales since the start of Coronavirus. What this tells me is that people are searching for an answer, searching for hope, and searching for comfort during this time of crisis. We, as the Church, need to help them see the truth. How can we reach out and grasp hold of those hearts that are longing for something spiritual? That question is what I hope to answer with all that we have planned. Matthew 5:16, "In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven." So again, thank you to those who are already helping and who plan on helping. You are doing much for the Kingdom of God here at Angleton!
