## FROM THE PREACHER'S DESK

### A Congregation that Loves

You may have noticed right at the start of Worship services this past Sunday that a police officer with the Angleton Police Department visited us. His immediate presence put me on alert, not because he was in uniform, but because my mind immediately thought of the sad moments that recently happened at a church building in Houston. Had he been called? Did we accidentally hit the "panic button" and not realize it? All those thoughts were quickly dispelled by the young officer, who let us know that he was there at the request of the police chief. They wanted local churches in Angleton to understand that the police department was there and would be checking more to ensure we could worship God without any issues or fears.

This was not the first time an officer has checked in like this, and it doesn't surprise me, considering the close relationship that the Angleton department has with the area congregations. Once a month, I attend a Public Safety Ministry Alliance meeting put on by the Angleton Police Department and hosted by a local church. During these meetings, we discuss various topics about city growth and how churches can help. Representatives from several city services were present, including police officers, firefighters, public works, city officials, and us preachers. So, when Officer Austin walked into our church building and told us they wanted to make sure the members felt comfortable and safe when they worshiped God, it didn't surprise me.

What surprised me was what happened right before he left. Standing in the back near the

communion tables, Officer Austin stayed for a while. After the prayer for the Lord's Supper, he came over to where I was sitting, said, "I reviewed your church," and handed me his card. I initially thought he had given us some suggestions and ideas about "church safety." I assumed I would read tips on what we could do better or what we might start to do to keep our worship services as safe as possible. That was not what was written on the card at all. Let me say this quickly: I don't share this message to gloat or out of pride. I debated sharing it; however, I thought it excellent and wanted to share with the congregation that your efforts in showing love do not go unnoticed. The card said:

"Excellent greeting, welcome with open arms, group effort congregation. Breath-taking atmosphere. Jesus led ministry. Great size church. Offers Bible study. I would recommend it as a top church in Angleton. Overall, a great place to be, very welcoming."

As of today, my family has been here for more than five years, and one of the factors that led to us accepting the job was the overwhelming sense of love shown. When we have visitors, there is no concern in my mind that they won't feel welcome. I watch as many people meet them, talk with them, and make them feel like family. And the card that was given to me by that young police officer is just further confirmation that the Angleton Church of Christ is a group of people who want to look like Jesus. I pray that we never stop; instead, we give more love to those who need it so that they can see the glory of God through us. Thank you so much! I am proud to be your preacher and proud of our members' efforts! God bless and have a great week!
