#### From the Preacher's Desk

"Lessons Learned"



Kaylee had her first soccer practice vesterday (Monday night for those who are reading this on any other day than Tuesday). She was super excited about her new team, and even more excited that I was going to be her coach. I hadn't planned on being her coach, but when the soccer club reached out and said they

desperately needed one, I jumped at the opportunity! Soccer has always been a big part of my life, and while I only ever played youth soccer, my father played through college and a bit professionally. He then began refereeing, and eventually got a job working for FIFA as an assessor. So, no surprise, soccer was on the tv a lot!

As I was coaching my first practice, I realized something that I wanted to share. I am in no way saying I have it all figured out, I don't. There were a couple of times when I thought in my mind, "what did I get myself into!" That being said, I wanted to share one lesson.

#### Coach the team you have, not the team you want.

Weeks before our first practice, I was planning what everything was going to look like, and what I wanted my team to look like. I had this image in my head of these girls taking all the fundamentals that I had taught and perfectly putting them into action. Don't get me wrong, I knew from the start that wasn't going to be the case, but I still had this image in my head of what I wanted the team to look like and studied techniques on how to hopefully get them there. As soon as we began, I realized that all that studying and preparing wasn't going to work. In the sports world, we all want to be the best. Even at the U7 level of youth soccer, we dream of being Major League good! However, that isn't real life. Each team is going to have its strengths and its weaknesses. I realized that my job as a coach wasn't to try and make the team I wanted, but rather, to take the team I had, maximize their strengths, and minimize their weaknesses.

I can't help but think about the Apostles as I write. We are often guilty of taking Peter, James, John, or any of the other men, and glorifying them beyond their abilities. We are often guilty of putting them on pedestals that even the real them couldn't achieve. The men that Jesus had to initially spread the good news were not perfect men. Many of them had great weaknesses, like the weaknesses we struggle with today. Peter's faith wasn't always strong, and at times he thought of his desires over the desires of God. However, for every weakness that the Apostles had, they also had great strength. The point that I am making is that God didn't have perfect men at his disposal. He didn't pick only perfect people, he chose who was available, and figured out ways to use them despite their weaknesses. He leaned upon their strengths, like Paul's ability to write, and worked to make them stronger.

As I was watching these girls play, I quickly realized that each of them had different skills, and instead of trying to produce the team I had dreamed up in my head, I needed to take what I had available and make t he best

team I could. Thus, coach the team you have, not the team you want. I honestly think you could apply this concept to our congregation. It's easy sometimes to look at how other congregations are doing things, and perhaps growing, and wanting to do things the same way. But what you can't forget is that the members they have and the members we have are not the same. Each of us has different skills, and the best thing for us to do is to figure out what those skills may be, here in Angleton, and put them to work. Only then will we develop into a truly effective congregation.

I'm not sure what lesson I hope you take from this, but what I do know is that the lessons for me as Kaylee's coach will probably never stop coming. And while you might assume nothing, I learned on the soccer field can't apply to your everyday life, or the work for the kingdom of God, vou'd be surprised. I know I was! God Bless! David Olmos
