"To All The Denise's Out There"

Have you ever found yourself discussing something with your spouse, only to realize your toddler can hear you from across the house? There are times, especially when Catherine and I are talking about things we want to keep private, like birthday gift ideas, when we have to take extreme measures to ensure our conversation remains confidential. Don't get me wrong—Kaylee isn't being nosy; she seems to have this superpower that allows her to multitask remarkably. She can hear and comprehend conversations around her, even while reading, listening to music, and coloring. If you've ever watched her during worship, it might seem like she's not paying attention because she's coloring or doing a word puzzle, when in fact, she can tell you exactly what was preached and the overall point of that message. Honestly, most kids have this ability to multitask effectively—unless you ask them to clean their room, and then they suddenly go deaf! It's for that reason—never knowing who might be listening—that we must think before we speak! But what about what we write?

When I started writing these articles in our bulletin, they were aimed primarily at the Angleton Church of Christ members. With that audience in mind, I often discussed upcoming events and evangelistic opportunities for our congregation. A few years into my work, I learned that people outside our church community were reading my bulletins. Suddenly, my audience expanded from about a hundred members to several hundred, if not thousands. There were occasions when individuals from across the nation reached out to let me know they enjoyed my recent articles or inquired about outreach opportunities we were involved in, hoping to replicate them at their churches.

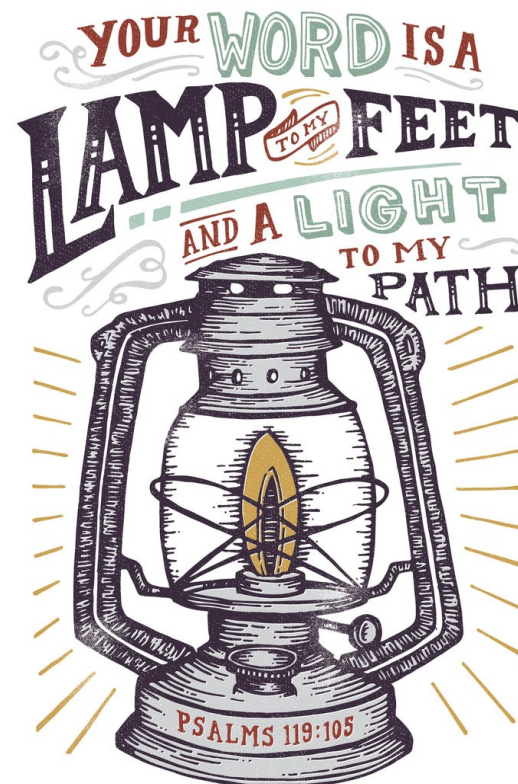
One particularly intriguing situation involved a secretary named Denise, whom I still haven't met. According to a close friend, she is a massive fan of my work. Her interest flattered me, but I couldn't stop thinking my words impacted someone I had never interacted with. This really made me reflect on what the Bible says about the power of words we speak and write. "So also the tongue is a small member, yet it boasts of great things. How great a forest is set ablaze by such a small fire," (James 3:5).

Unfortunately, at this very moment, the state of California is facing devastating wildfires like it hasn't in a long time. What's most perplexing is that it all began as a small, easily containable fire. However, due to the strength of the winds, that tiny fire quickly escalated into a blaze that threatened entire cities and, if not controlled, could impact the whole state. I used to think my articles were merely a collection of words that only a few people would read, but I've realized this is far from the truth. People like Denise, who live in cities far from my own, are reading my words and finding encouragement and inspiration. This realization has led me to reflect on what I say and what I choose to share. Perhaps this is an essential lesson for all of us.

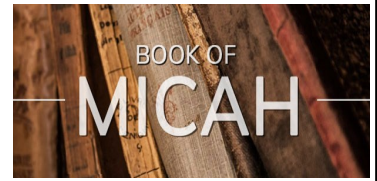

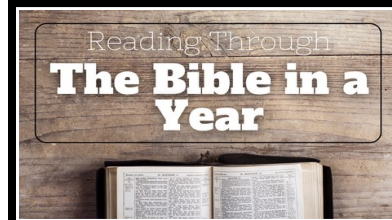
There will be a **Teen Devo** this Sunday evening, January 19th, hosted by the Sanford's!
