## From the Preacher's Desk

"New Year...New Theme!"

This past Sunday, during our morning worship hour, I introduced our theme for the 2022 year. "My Life for His Glory" is something that I have been working on for some time, and I wanted to take a moment and give you a more detailed description of each of our months.

**January: "Same God, New Year"** – Every year we have an opportunity to look within ourselves and create better versions of ourselves. While most people resolve to do this physically, I think it's important to do it spiritually as well. Are you the best Christian you can be? The only caveat is that we don't change God, or assume He needs to be changed. His truth and Word are perfect.

**February: "A Heart for God"** – Thanks to Hallmark, the month of February is a month most associate with love. Love so happens to be the core and foundation of God's whole Bible. From beginning to end it is full of love. What destroys a heart for God? That is something we need to uncover.

**March: "What do you believe?"** – What do we do when people believe differently? With an ever-changing world, and morality constantly being redefined, we come face-to-face with more people who don't believe in God's Truth as we do. It's important that we remind ourselves why we believe in God, ask ourselves do we really understand what we read and hear, and share our knowledge with the world, because God's truth can save more than just ourselves.

**May: "For Better or Worse"** – What is marriage? How is it defined? Why is yours not working as well as someone else's? The sanctity of marriage is very important to God, as it should be to all Christians. Have we lost sight of how important our marriage is, and how do we make it work when there are so many other things going on in our lives?

**June: "Hot Seat"** – Tough topics are often skipped over because people can get offended. Well, it's time to offend people with God's Truth! Abortion, substance abuse, and homosexuality are just the tip of the iceberg.

**July: "God at the Movies"** – As a movie buff, I am really excited about this month. As a movie buff, I have found it difficult to watch movies and television these days because there is so much sin being shown. How do we navigate Hollywood as a Christian? Also, can we learn spiritual lessons from non-spiritual movies! Let's find out!

**August: "Fact Check"** – This month was requested by many. Can we talk about those topics that aren't "hot button" topics, but people can't seem to agree on? What's the definition of worship? What does the Bible say about the Holy Spirit? Did dinosaurs walk alongside man?

**September: "Your Mess Matters"** – We are all broken in some way. Some people hide their imperfections because they don't want to bother other people with their issues. You matter, and so do your struggles. God wants us to work together.

**October: "The Things We Hide"** – What you do in private might be hidden from your church family, but you can't hide from God! Just looking like a Christian isn't being a Christian!

**November: "Gratitude Attitude"** – There are a lot of things that I am thankful for, in my life. Sometimes I don't do or say anything about those thanks. It's time for us to have an attitude of gratitude.

**December: "The Best for Last"** – What will our last days on earth look like? Might be important for us to examine that idea just a little bit further.

I hope you are as excited about this year as I am. Even though my lessons are fully fleshed out for the whole of 2022, that doesn't mean you can't suggest some additional thoughts and ideas. I would love to hear what you have to offer. If I can't fit it in the mornings, there are always evening lessons. Speaking of Sunday evenings, I'm changing up what I'm preaching on. I have been studying Christian Evidence a lot and am excited to preach on the subject. More about that this Sunday! Until then, God bless and have a great week!





On Sunday, January 30, we will have a parent meeting to discuss the 2022 Youth calendar. This will happen directly following morning service.
