

From the Preacher's Desk

"Nothing Near Biblical"

Our area has experienced its fair share of rain the past few weeks. Our girls love to be outside, and while it's fun to jump in muddy puddles every so often, it can get frustrating when every day it rains and rains forcing you to spend most of your time indoors. Even our littlest has been singing "rain, rain, go away" more frequently than she does normally. My response to their disappointment and frustration is the same I would say to anyone, "It'll go away soon, just be patient."

Over the past 200 years, Harris County has experienced around 30 or so "flood events" according to the Flood Control District. On their website (hcfcd.org) it says, "A major flood occurs somewhere in Harris County about every two years." Even our county, Brazoria, has experienced its fair share of floods, which come with destroying homes, taking lives, and devastating many.

This morning (7/13/21), I was going through my routine of reading through news articles and current events. I was surprised to learn that London, England is currently experiencing a torrential amount of rainfall. Areas that have never flooded, are currently underwater. My heart and prayers go out to all of those who are struggling during this difficult time, not only in London but around the world. However, what bothered me about the article was the tagline: "Biblical rainstorms bring chaos..."

I understand that times are tough, but there is nothing that we have experienced on this earth that can be compared to the biblical floods found in the book of Genesis. Our world was filled with so much sin, so much lust of the flesh, so much pride that God's only hope was to hit the "reset" button. Genesis 6:17, "For behold, I will bring a

flood of waters upon the earth to destroy all flesh in which is the breath of life under heaven. Everything that is on the earth shall die." While our recent rain activity here in Texas has felt like 40 days and 40 nights, we should be blessed to know we will never experience anything likened unto those in the days of Noah.
