FROM THE PREACHER

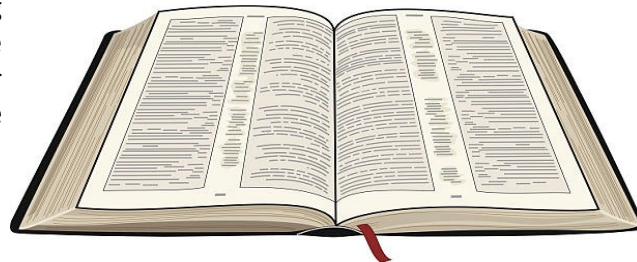
My Preferred Bible Translation: English Standard Version

Since I will be doing so much Bible reading during classes and sermons, I thought I would take a moment to talk about my preferred Bible translation: the English Standard Version (ESV). I was introduced to the ESV through Bible Bowl many years ago and since then I have made it my default Bible translation. Anytime I'm reading from the Bible during a class or sermon, I'll be reading from the ESV unless I specify otherwise. Since not everyone is using an ESV Bible, I try to make a point of putting the primary passages that I'm reading on the PowerPoint slides, that way everyone can see the text of what is being read. The ESV is a relatively new translation, first being published in 2001, but its lineage goes back to the venerable King James Version. Essentially, the ESV is part of a series of translation revisions that deliberately seek to maintain continuity with the KJV.

Now, the ESV is not a perfect translation – no translation is absolutely perfect – but it is an exceptionally well-done translation. There are many great translations of the Bible into English; we are abundantly blessed in that regard. One thinks of the (New) King James Version, New American Standard, New International Version, and many others. I frequently read and reference those translations and you would be well-served with any of them. However, what sets the ESV apart in my mind is its balance of word-for-word translation, readability, and formal language. Some translations sacrifice formality for readability, others (such as the KJV) have very formal language, but can be difficult to read at times. The ESV is very readable, but manages to maintain a good measure of formality in its language, which I find very appealing. In the Preface to the ESV, the translation committee lets the reader know that they “sought to be ‘as literal as possible’ while maintaining clarity of expression and literary excellence,” and they did a great job accomplishing that goal.

Again, I will say that the ESV is not perfect and I will at times point to a different translation as capturing the nuance or clarity of an expression in a better way. (Perhaps I should also add that I do not receive any commission for promoting the ESV!) However, even if the ESV is not perfect, it is phenomenal. If you're thinking about trying a new Bible translation, I would recommend an ESV. If you prefer to have the same translation in your hand as the preacher during sermons, know that I will be carrying an ESV Bible into the pulpit each Sunday. But whatever translation of the Bible you prefer, just make sure you're reading it!
