From the Preacher's Desk - "Four Gospels and a Thank You!"

This Sunday begins a new month, and a new series a part of our yearly theme: *Faith that Counts*. We are going to be considering the "Four Gospels" of God's Holy scripture: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. People often wonder why four books tell the story of Jesus. The basic answer is that the four gospels all tell us the same story but from four different viewpoints and audiences.

Imagine you were outside standing at the corner when you witness a car crash. The police ask you to share what you saw, and you paint a picture of the events: "the SUV ran the stop sign and hit the side of the truck." At the same time, across the street, another witness gives their account: "the red SUV ran the stop sign and hit the two-door Chevy truck." While it may seem these stories are different, they aren't. They both talk about the same crash just from different perspectives. So, it is with the four Gospels of Jesus Christ. Each is written from another point of view, and personality, which helps to create a more precise picture of the "Good News" of God. This idea of multiple witnesses is something mentioned in both the Old

Testament and New Testament: **Deuteronomy 19:15**, "A single witness shall not suffice against a person for any crime or for any wrong in connection with any offense that he has committed. Only on the evidence of two witnesses or of three witnesses shall a charge be established." **1 Timothy 5:19**, "Do not admit a charge against an elder except on the evidence of two or three witnesses."

Multiple witnesses ensure the truth being shared is valid. When you have only one person claiming something, especially against another, whose word do you take as truth? Now imagine if we only had Matthew's perspective of the story of Christ. How do we know what Matthew wrote is true if there is nothing to compare it to? You can see detractors of God's Word questioning Jesus' legitimacy when only one person saw it all happen. I believe this is why God didn't give us only one account, He gave us four. Four books with unity in the overall message, but their own identity, purpose, and flavor. While some might think multiple points of view mean a greater chance of contradictions, that's not the case with God's Word. The omissions and additions from one account to the next are purposeful. 2 Timothy 3:16, "ALL scripture is breathed out by God...". For example, Mark didn't need to prove that Jesus was the king of Israel, because the Roman audience didn't care about that. So, Mark leaves out several things that Matthew does not, and vice versa. We will discuss this idea more in our series, but I believe we do ourselves a disservice trying to harmonize what God never intended to harmonize. There is unity in the Four Gospels regarding salvation found through Christ, but their diversity is what makes them so intriguing, and I am excited to uncover the Gospels and share them with you each Sunday morning!

THANK YOU!!! I wanted to take a moment and thank all those who came out and helped at the Peach Street Market this past weekend. This is the second time that we have been a part of this farmer's market and each time has been both fun and a blessing to the congregation. We passed out water, Bible material, took prayer requests, and got to know more members of our community. I think we should make Peach Street a monthly effort for this congregation, and if that happens, I encourage you to be a part of the work. We are commanded to preach and teach to the world, and while I'm not out there with a bullhorn sharing the truth, our members were out there spreading Christianity through their actions. 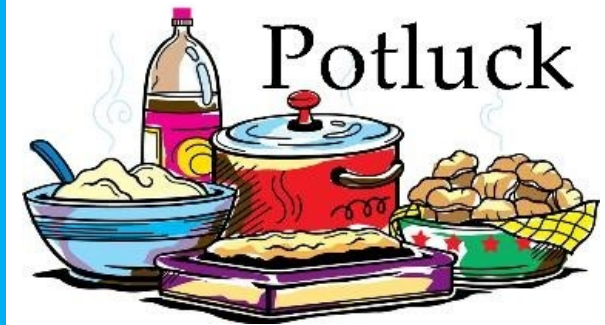
