

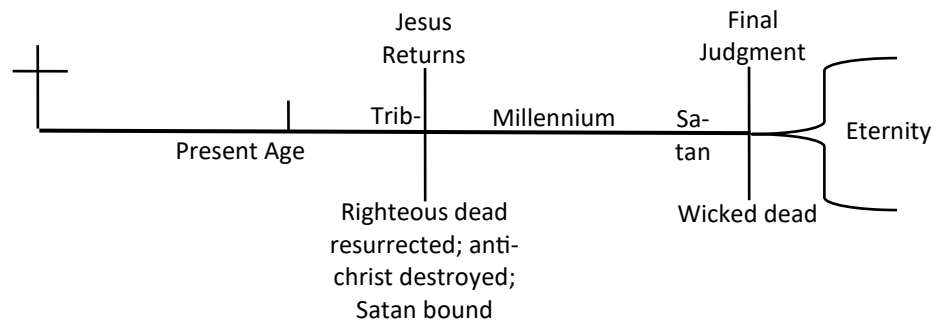

Views on “the Millennium”: Historic Premillennialism

Having considered a- and post- millennialism, we now move on to premillennialism. It is very important to note at the outset that there are two versions of premillennialism: historic and dispensational. While the two versions have several things in common, there are also some crucial differences. The most important difference is that dispensational premillennialism draws a sharp distinction between Israel and the Church as two distinct peoples of God, while historic premillennialism does not make such a distinction – more on that next week.

Unlike a- & post- millennialism, historic premillennialism argues that Jesus will return *before* the millennium (hence, *pre*-millennialism). According to premillennialism, the world will progressively get worse, concluding with a period of tribulation: a time of intense persecution and the rule of a literal antichrist figure. At the end of the tribulation period, Jesus will return to reign on earth for 1000 years, the antichrist will be destroyed, Satan will be bound, and the *righteous* dead will be resurrected to enjoy Jesus’s millennial kingdom. This will be a period of peace and flourishing. While not everyone on earth will be truly converted to Christianity, everyone will obey Jesus as king. Historic premillennialism sometimes (but definitely not always) proposes that during the millennium, a temple will be built in Jerusalem (see Ezekiel 40–48 for what some call the “millennial temple”); however, this idea is more common in dispensational premillennialism.

After 1000 years of Jesus reigning on earth, Satan will be released for a short period of time. Satan will rally his forces and stage one final attack, but will be defeated by Jesus. After this battle, the *wicked* dead will then be resurrected, there will be final judgment, followed by eternity. Visually, a simplified historic premillennialism would look something like this:



Historic (unlike dispensational) premillennialism has a long history, and can be found in some of the earliest post-New Testament writings. Premillennialism in its various forms is very common outside of churches of Christ and, taking historic and dispensational together, is the most common understanding of the millennium. What most people do not realize is that historic premillennialism was actually fairly common within churches of Christ in the 19th and early 20th centuries. To one degree or another, historic premillennialism was held by Barton Stone, Moses Lard, David Lipscomb, and James Harding, among others. Despite this, in the early 20th century premillennialism in any form became the topic of intense debate, and by the mid-20th century premillennialism was all but eradicated from within churches of Christ. Nevertheless, a small group of congregations continue to teach premillennialism to this day.

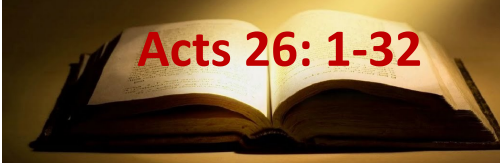
