FROM THE PREACHER'S DESK

I stepped into Starbucks, as I do every Tuesday morning, to work and make myself available to the community and members of this congregation. After ordering my venti cold brew, I sat in the corner, opened my computer, and connected to the internet. By habit, the first site I visited was Facebook. Not only do I like to check and see what's going on with family and friends, I also post that I am here and ready to take prayers from those who have a need. Unlike most Tuesdays, today didn't go as planned because when I opened Facebook, it wouldn't let me log in. My immediate thought was someone had hacked me. I texted Catherine and told her to keep an eye on my account and let me know if anything suspicious appeared on my page. In seconds, Catherine texted back that her Facebook and Instagram were acting similarly. I jokingly told her that our nation was under a cyber-attack and returned to my regular work.

After sitting here for a few more minutes, I opened Google and did a quick search about the problem, and to no surprise, news agencies were going frantic with headlines like, "FACEBOOK DOWN! GLOBAL DISSASTER!" I chuckled a bit after reading this and several other similar articles, but I quickly realized that I was bothered that I couldn't post any updates. Like I imagine many others, I kept refreshing the page, hoping it would magically load and let me back on...to do what? It's not like I'm on Facebook all day, every day. Why was I bothered that I couldn't access it now?

I sat there quietly, contemplating why I was troubled and consumed with something so trivial as having access a social media website. Then it dawned on me: we as a society have become dependent and addicted to technology in a hazardous way. How do I know that? Because I was experiencing it first-hand. Internally, I asked myself, "How will I ask people if they need any prayers?" Here's a thought...CALL THEM! Start calling people and asking them directly. The reason people love technology is that it makes certain things seem more manageable. For example, I can reach out to all my "friends" on Facebook with a single post,

asking for prayers or sharing God's truth, making me feel like I'm doing good work. Don't get me wrong, there isn't anything wrong with using technology in this way, but are we guilty of becoming so reliant on "social media" to be social that we stop connecting altogether?

God speaks often about the need to build up, edify, and strengthen our brothers and sisters in Christ. Consider what the writer said in Hebrews 10:25, "Not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near." Many apply this to our Worship each Lord's Day, but I believe God wants this applied to every opportunity Christians have to come together. When our spiritual family surrounds us, we can influence, encourage, and strengthen each other in ways we can't when we interact through the World Wide Web. The biggest issue with "online worship" is our inability to fellowship in person. I respect the fact that some need it because they physically can't come to worship, perhaps due to a sickness; however, that same technology has become a tool for Satan in the hearts of many. Instead of worshipping together, lifting each other as God desires, we worship through a screen. But what happens the day that goes away? What if Facebook never fixes itself? How will we ever communicate with one another again?

The fact that I was bothered with Facebook being down, and it making me feel like I couldn't connect with my family and friends, made me realize that it controls me more than I realize. So, expect a phone call today and in the next coming days, with me simply asking, "How can I pray for you?" And if the phone lines ever go down, you can expect a knock on your door! Here's the point: nothing can stop us from doing what God wants us to do! Also, if the only way you socialize is through apps like Facebook, you aren't really socializing!
