From the Preacher's Desk

"A Message to Our Graduates"

You probably don't remember, but there was a time when you could not read or write when you had to rely on others for help through some of the simplest tasks you do today without thinking. You also don't remember, but there was a time when fun was sitting down and listening to someone read you a book. Whether it was at bedtime, or school in the library from one of your teachers, books provided an adventure without having to go anywhere. While some people still love to escape in a good book, most have abandoned the ancient art form for the new mediums built around technology. What you may have failed to realize when you were little, that you'll learn as you get older, are the number of lessons that came from those innocent stories told before bed. Lessons on courage, strength, and determination. So, I want to inspire you, as your time in high school comes to an end, by going back to the beginning. I want to read you a portion of a children's book by an author you are probably very familiar with. Although our story may rhyme and seem childish, I hope you'll listen to the words, because it's one of the greatest lessons you'll ever be taught.
