## FROM THE PREACHER

### What is Repentance of an Unscriptural Remarriage? #3, Matthew 19:9

One of the primary arguments made for the “perpetual adultery” view of unscriptural remarriage is Matthew 19:9 which reads,

“And I say to you: whoever divorces his wife, except for sexual immorality, and marries another, commits adultery.”

The argument made is this: the form of the verb that Jesus uses for “commits adultery” necessarily means ongoing action. This being so, the last part of the verse could properly be translated along the lines of, “*continues to commit* adultery.” My position, on the other hand, is that it is the act of divorce and remarriage itself that constitutes adultery, with no reference to an ongoing state; Jesus is only describing the moral character of the act of divorce and remarriage.

I’ll cut to the conclusion on the Greek: the type of verb Jesus uses for “commits adultery” is present indicative. Whether or not such a verb is continuous is determined solely by context. Often, such verbs simply describe an action with no continuity implied. When continuity is implied, it is because other parts of the context or sentence structure demand it. Context is king.

Speaking of context, in Matthew 19:9 Jesus is answering a particular question: “Is it lawful to divorce one’s wife for any cause?” (19:3). The question is not about remarriage or repentance, but what constitutes a lawful divorce. In addition, Jesus’s answer does not address what to do when a divorce and remarriage have already occurred. We need to keep in mind that the questions about remarriage and repentance that we are bringing to the text are *not* the questions Jesus was directly answering.

As to the structure of the verse, consider a comparison with 1 Corinthians 11:26,

“For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, **you proclaim** the Lord’s death until he comes.” (Note: “*you proclaim*” is the same type of verb as “*commits adultery*”)

We do not read 1 Corinthians 11:26 and come to the conclusion that a person enters a perpetual state of proclamation after taking the Lord’s Supper. Paul is simply saying that whenever the Lord’s Supper is taken, Jesus’s death is proclaimed in that action. I suggest that it is the same with Matthew 19:9. It is not that a person enters a perpetually adulterous relationship by divorcing and remarrying; it is the act of divorce and remarriage itself that constitutes adultery. Just as 1 Corinthians 11:26 indicates that “When this act occurs (the Lord’s Supper), this is what happens in that moment,” so Matthew 19:9 indicates that “When this act occurs (divorce and remarriage), this is what happens in that moment.” When a person takes the Lord’s Supper, they proclaim Jesus’s death; when a person divorces and remarries, they commit adultery. Nothing is said about entering into an ongoing state in either instance. And nothing is said in Matthew 19:9 about the need to dissolve a remarriage.

Again, the conclusion that an unscripturally remarried couple must divorce in order to repent is not explicit in the text, but is only inferred based on a particular reading. In Matthew 19:9, Jesus does not define a sinful remarriage as perpetually adulterous; He describes the moral character of the act of divorce and remarriage. We should insist on something more than inference before demanding the dissolution of marriages.
