We are excited about the opportunity to reach out and fellowship with our community, and I'm grateful to all those who have signed up to help. There's still a lot of work that we need to do before Saturday, so if you would like to help in any way, we would love to have you.

Wednesday evening during our "Wednesday Night with the Master" time, we will be wrapping and packing all the water bottles that we need. Last year we gave out more water than we realized and are planning on increasing that number this year.

On Thursday evening, a small group of us are coming up in the late afternoon to work on some delicious gifts that we will also be handing out. We will be labeling bags, and making chocolate-covered cookie dough bites in celebration of the Holiday event! We plan on meeting up here around 4:30 p.m., if you would like to join us.

Saturday afternoon, the day of the event, I plan on being at the building between 1:30-2:00 p.m. to pack up the rest of the van and get ready for set up. I plan on leaving around 2:40 p.m. for the courthouse parking lot where we have two booths waiting. We have several people signed up to help, but the more the merrier!

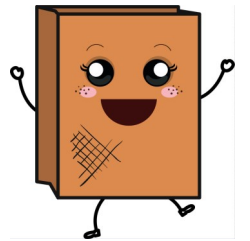
End-of-Year Schedule
