FROM THE PREACHER'S DESK

"A Young Heart...With Ancient Wisdom"

I want to begin with an important statement: I have permission to share the following story with you. I was passionately encouraged to do so by the young man who told me, "Share it with anyone and everyone you can because the way people live their lives needs to change." I have chosen to keep his identity private out of respect, even though he didn't ask me to. All that said, I would like to highlight a special moment that occurred this past Lord's Day.

At the end of each service, I stand in the foyer to greet as many members and visitors as possible before they leave. Once the crowd begins to thin, I head back into the auditorium to engage with those who have stayed behind to fellowship in various groups. On this particular day, a large group was gathered to talk with the Alsobrooks, as it was their final weekend with our church family before they moved north. As I walked over, I noticed a young adult who was not a congregation member but had been visiting for some time. He's someone I always make it a point to reach out to and talk with him to check in on how he is doing.

Something was off; he seemed a bit disheveled, unlike himself. When I asked how things were going, I saw tears welling in his eyes. I immediately sat down next to him, put my arm around him, and allowed him to cry. After a few moments, he told me that a close friend had just passed away, and it was hitting him hard. We talked for a while about why these things happen, the importance of sorrow and sadness, and how to find comfort and strength in God.

At that point, I noticed he had written something in a notebook he brings with him regularly. I asked if I could read what he had written, thinking it might be a poem, and he happily shared it with me. This is what he wrote:

(10.27.24)

**Regret what you say to people!
Think with your head!
Help people when needed!**

**Baptize some one!
Redeem yourself!
Never give up!
Don't name call individuals!
Keep on supporting!**

His words held a simple yet profound truth; I immediately wanted to share them with as many people as possible. Through tears, he often said, "We don't know how much time we have left; we need to cherish every moment. Be kind and help others." I wholeheartedly agree. Philippians 2:4 states, "Let each of you look not only to his own interests but also to the interests of others." Hebrews 13:16 reminds us, "Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God." Additionally, Galatians 6:2 encourages us to "Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ."

When we lose someone we love, there is nothing we can do to bring them back, but that doesn't mean they can't remain with us in spirit. I encouraged this young man to reflect on something his friend did or how he lived his life that was morally good and to use that as motivation for making good choices in his own life. While our loved ones may no longer be present, the lessons we learned from them can stay with us forever if we allow them to. Paul emphasized this by saying, "Be imitators of me, as I am of Christ."

Suppose you find this week incredibly stressful, going through something at home, work, or school. In that case, I hope you find encouragement in the words of a young man whose heart was hurting yet recognized how blessed we are to wake up each day and not take that for granted. James reminds us, "Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds, for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness" (James 1:2-3). Thank God this week for what you have and live your life in a way you will regret nothing! May God bless you this week and in all the weeks to come!
