

From the Preacher's Desk

Thirteen Rules for a Happy Marriage

One of my favorite quotes about marriage says, "Don't marry the person you think you can live with; marry the person you think you can't live without." Marriage used to be something sacred in our country. It was something that used to be special, a bond and connection made between a man and woman who wanted to spend the rest of their lives together. Marriage has changed. The further that society got away from God the worse the marriage relationship seemed to get. Fifty years ago, when a relationship was struggling, people fought to fix it. Husbands and wives found out what the problem was and tried to make it better. Nowadays a simple argument or bump in the road can cause two people to give up and quit and end their marriage completely. I hate divorce, and for a good reason, because God hates it too. Malachi 2:16 says, "For the Lord God of Israel says that He hates divorce, for it covers one's garment with violence." The reason God hates divorce so much can be seen in the previous verse, Malachi 2:15, "But did He not make them one, having a remnant of the Spirit..." The definition of marriage, as found in the Bible, is the joining of one man and one woman forever, (Genesis 2:24). That bond is a special covenant relationship like no other relationship. It is not something to be taken lightly, but to be cherished. For that reason, when things get tough, as they will in most marriages, giving up is not an option. Therefore, I want to give you a few rules to live by to help ensure you have a happy marriage.

1. Never both be angry at the same time.
2. Never yell at each other unless the house is on fire.
3. Remember that it takes two to make an argument. The one who is wrong is the one who will be doing most of the talking.
4. Yield to the wishes of the other – as an exercise in self-discipline, if you can't think of a better reason.

5. If you have a choice between making yourself or your spouse look good – choose your spouse.
6. If you feel you must criticize, do so lovingly.
7. Never bring up a mistake of the past.
8. Neglect the whole world rather than each other
9. Never let the day end without saying at least one complimentary thing to your spouse.
10. Never meet without an affectionate greeting. It's okay to show people that you love one another, especially in front of your children.
11. When you've made a mistake, talk it out and ask for forgiveness.
12. Never go to bed mad.
13. Always put God first, lean upon His Word, and remember that a couple who prays together stays together.

These "rules" are just a few that I have found work wonders in any marriage relationship. When you step back and look at them, you may notice that many require focusing on your spouse more than yourself. This attitude is what has been lacking in our society, a society that is all about selfishness. Most marriages that end in divorce end because of selfishness. The person you choose to spend the rest of your life with should be someone you are willing to do anything for. Ephesians 5:25 may only be speaking to husbands, but it shows us the love that comes with marriage. It says, "Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the church and gave Himself for her." If we love our spouses as God desired, then we can rest assured that our marriage will only ever get stronger. However, if you ever find yourself struggling, lean upon God. The world might tell you a divorce is an option, but quitting is not the answer. Turn to God, read His Word, pray together, and grow closer physically and more importantly spiritually. God bless!
