What is our 24 hours of Prayer event?


We can all agree that prayer is important. John 15:7 says, "If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you." Paul when writing to the people of Thessalonica said, "Pray without ceasing..." (1 Thess. 5:17). This verse in particular has caused many people to question, "Does God expect me to pray every second of every day?" The answer to that is, no. God understands we have limitations; however, the point made by Paul and impressed upon us is the importance of a steady, habitual, prayer life. With everything in our world constantly changing and affecting our physical bodies, it's important that we are steadily talking to our God, if for no other reason than He is the only constant we have in our lives.

I know there are things that we need and want to say to God. I also know that many in our community, and our world, could use prayers, but don't know what to do or say. With that in mind, we decided to offer a 24 hours of prayer event. A chance for our congregation to lift up our voices to the Lord in supplications and thanksgivings. Here is what you need to know about September 25th through the 26th.

1. Yes! This will be a literal 24 hours of prayer. We will begin at 9 a.m. on Friday and end at 9 a.m. on Saturday.
2. No! You personally will not be praying for 24 hours straight. This is a congregational effort, with many members taking specific 30 minute increments in which they will pray to God.
3. Yes! Women are allowed to participate! This even is not public. We will not be meeting at the building and praying in a mixed assembly. These prayers are personal and private. They can be done wherever you like. For that reason, ladies are welcome and encouraged to sign-up.
4. No! You won't need to come up with the topics for prayer, we will help. We already have members of our community, as well as our congregation, who have asked for specific prayers. You will be provided a card with these specific prayers, along with a topic, for example, first responders, city officials, teachers, our nation's leaders, etc. What you say is up to you!
5. Yes! You need to sign up! We have a list in the foyer with time slots available. This is your time and we are going to ask that you stick with it. If your time is at 12:30 p.m., you will end at 1 p.m. Whoever is signed up at 1 p.m. will then begin their prayer. Thus, 24 hours of straight prayer to God!

Yes! You can sign up for multiple slots. I am already planning on taking several of the over-night slots, but the more the merrier!

This is something that we hope to do each year, and we hope you'll jump on board and be apart of it all. If you have any other questions, please don't hesitate to ask me or Michael!
